Director's Update =



This fall, MIRECC Core and Laboratory leaders spent a half-day retreat in Kernersville sharing our collective accomplishments and outlining future Center goals. I am thrilled to report that in FY 23. VISN 6 MIRECC investigators enjoyed great success with both intramural and extramural grant funding and we welcomed many new VA Career Development Awardees and first time Merit Awardees.

Additionally, our mission to enhance post-deployment mental health and wellness for our Nation's Veterans and their families has extended to include subject matter expertise in Veteran Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and a developing focus on mental health and aging. Our genetics laboratory is using 'big data' to identify key genetic predictors of suicide and our interventions and metabolomics laboratory is conducting medication trials for the treatment of multiple mental health disorders. Our imaging laboratory identified multiple genetic markers that influence the volume of emotion-regulation centers in the brain and our health services research lab is conducting multiple clinical trials to examine the clinical effectiveness of mobile contingency management for smoking and alcohol use disorder. Our neuroscience lab continues to evaluate the relationship between neuropeptides and fear with an expanding interest in posttraumatic epilepsy and toxic exposures. In addition, our Education Core continues to integrate the latest technologies to improve education and clinical outcomes and our Clinical Core is supporting multiple programs and projects to increase available services to Veterans and their families.

A huge congratulations and sincere gratitude to our Center leaders and staff for the innovative and impactful work they do every day. We are making differences in the lives of so many Veterans and their families.

The goal of this project is to utilize remote neurobehavioral testing technology to collect and computationally model decision-making about risk under ambiguity in Veterans who continue using prescribed opioid analgesics for chronic pain despite provider preferences. This study aims to understand covert motivational biases of these patients, to better inform providers on how to frame the prospect of opioid tapering.







PACERS is an education program for health care staff who care for Veterans with cognitive disorders and their caregivers. While this program targets rural health care staff, providers working in any setting can benefit from this information.

The PACERS online training curriculum includes six e-learning courses; each courses is accredited for 1 hour of continuing education. There are also 5 videos that cover important topics related to cognitive impairment, including driving, self-neglect, challenging behaviors, Alzheimer's disease, and end-of-life.
