Purpose Statement:

The purpose of this educational conference is to address the practice and knowledge gaps of VHA health care professionals' ability to work in Primary Care-Mental Health Integration (PC-MHI) programs. The Uniform Mental Health Services Handbook requires that mental health staff will provide care management and co-located collaborative service in all primary care clinics. However few VA mental health staff members have been trained in the population-based models of care required to function effectively in primary care. To address this gap, this training will cover key issues that are important to successfully implement and sustain PC-MHI programs. This practical training will cover the basics of PC-MH integration, as well as evidence-based skills needed for successful Co-located Collaborative Care (CCC), and Care Management (CM) service delivery.

Target Audience:

Frontline Clinicians including, but not limited to: Physicians, Psychologists, Social Workers, Nurses, Nurse Practitioners, Physician Assistants and other advanced practice professionals. Mental Health and Primary Care Leadership and Administrators may also find this program beneficial.

At the conclusion of this educational program, learners should be able to:

1. Discuss how evidenced-based MH interventions for Veterans can be implemented and sustained in your integrated primary care setting;
2. Describe and apply the skills of CCC and CM;
3. Use the Behavioral Health Lab (BHL) software for measurement-based CCC and CM practice; and
4. Cite the common challenges and solutions to implementation of integrated primary care systems.
