Develop acceptable, effective, and scalable interventions that prevent trauma-related outcomes, such as PTSD and suicide

Dr. Emmy Betz OVERALL OBJECTIVE:

Implement <u>acceptable</u>, <u>effective</u> interventions for suicide prevention in military populations, with a focus on <u>universal secure storage</u> and <u>voluntary reductions in firearm access</u> during at-risk periods to decrease death.

Only 10% of people with suicidal thoughts/actions die by suicide (Owens 2002)



But 85-90% of people who use a gun for suicide **die** (e.g., Spicer 2000)



There is often a **short period** of final deliberation

(Hawton 2007, Deisenhammer 2009)



~3x risk of suicide death in homes with firearms (Miller M et al, 2002, 2005, 2007, 2013)
