Last month, Dr. Ron Murphy visited Salisbury VAMC to present a talk and a workshop sponsored by the MIRECC Education component on his innovative approach to engaging veterans in mental health treatment. Dr. Murphy began to develop his techniques while with the Palo Alto VAMC PTSD program. He is presently a visiting professor at Bowdoin College in Maine. Next year Dr. Murphy will be taking a position as an Associate Professor in Psychology at Francis Marion University in Florence, SC. His proximity will facilitate developing collaborations with VISN 6.



On March 13, Dr. Murphy gave an outreach talk to the community about the challenges of getting veterans with mental health difficulties the help that they need. More than half of veterans needing treatment will not seek it due to stigma and other problems. Dr. Murphy has been developing methods to overcome the roadblocks that prevent veterans from receiving help.

A discussion session followed Dr. Murphy's talk. He was joined by a panel of experts representing the Veteran Centers and Community (continued on next page)

Mental Health Service Line Subcouncil Conference

The VISN 6 Mental Health Service Line held its Spring Subcouncil Conference on February 13 - 14 2006 at the Salisbury VAMC. The first afternoon was dedicated to presentations from the Research, Education and Clinical components of the MIRECC. Dr. McCarthy (Director) gave the introductory remarks. Dr. Hurley (CoDirector, Education) gave an overview of the new Clinical Education Grants

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Based Outpatient Clinics (CBOCs). These providers are on the front lines, working to engage returning veterans in treatment.



Members of the audience and the panel discussed practical strategies for improving outreach to returning veterans. The presentation was covered by local media.

Dr. Murphy's talk was part of a MIRECC Clinical Education Project developed by Harry Piersma (staff psychologist), Jackie Friedman (psychologist, MIRECC Education trainee) and Debra Volkmer (social worker, Seamless Transition Coordinator) of the Salisbury VAMC and funded by the MIRECC Education component. The talk and discussion were videotaped by MIRECC educational staff, and will be available for viewing on the MIRECC website shortly.

On March 14 and 15, Dr. Murphy presented a workshop for mental health care providers on his Motivational Enhancement techniques. The emphasis of this workshop was on working with veterans with PTSD. A particular focus was engaging returning OIF/OEF veterans in treatment. Dr. Murphy demonstrated his four session protocol for workshop attendees. This protocol centers on helping veterans
