A Paradigm Shifting Event

The six-month follow-up meeting to the Conference on Family Assistance for OIF/OEF Veterans was held in March. (An account of the first meeting can be found in the August 2006 issue.) The purpose of the first conference was to review existing 'Best Practices' for improving veterans' care by supporting family readjustment. Staff from five VA Medical Centers (VISNs 5 and 6) participated.



They were drawn from many disciplines (including Seamless Transition Case Managers, Chaplains, Mental Health Providers, Public Affairs Officers, Voluntary Service Chiefs, and Patient Advocates). Staff from each medical center formed a planning team. Each team developed three care interventions by the end of the first meeting.

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Community Outreach

Dr. Jennifer Strauss was recently interviewed by several news organizations about her innovative clinical research!



She is developing the use of guided imagery for treatment of post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Her work was included in an article entitled *Treating PTSD in Non-Traditional Ways*, written by J. Arenofsky and published in the February 2007 issue of **Veterans of Foreign War Magazine**. As a result, the Herald Sun, Winston Salem Journal, and ABC 11 TV featured her research program.

Post Deployment Mental Health

Nancy Hauck, MSW and Debra Volkmer, MSW from the Salisbury OIF/OEF START program met with the clinical staff of the University of North

Carolina – Greensboro Counseling and Testing Center on March 30th. Ms. Volkmer, Coordinator of the program and Ms. Hauck, one of the program case mangers, discussed with the staff the variety of challenges that returning combat veterans are experiencing when they enter college. They were able to present information about the wide variety of services offered to our returning combat veterans by the VA medical center. The UNC-G staff recommended that the OIF/OEF Start program participate in their annual student orientation to provide additional outreach to "student/soldiers".

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At the second meeting, each team presented their projects. They detailed both the implementation process and outcomes of the interventions they had developed. They also shared best practices, and explored new ways to promote veteran resiliency through family assistance.



Dr. Harold Kudler (MIRECC Acting Director) led the conference planning. He presented the end-of-meeting summary and discussion of each team's successes and



challenges in developing new strategies incorporate preferences of OIF/ OEF veterans and their families. The process will continue with dissemination to other VISNs as well as ongoing evaluation.

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Update: DoD and VA Family Transition Program

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Here are a few of the successful projects that were presented:



Durham VA created a multidisciplinary OIF/OEF clinical care team. The team meets regularly to develop and implement joint projects. One project resulted in changing hospital policy to allow children to visit or accompany their veteran parent. Another resulted in creation of phone cards and travel cups with VA information for distribution to returning veterans at PDHRA events. (Team Durham)

A "Welcome Home Festival" is planned for June 2006. It will include attributes of a Health Fair. StandDown or WinterHaven event. The Washington DC VA is coordinating this festival with a DoD event, and has a host of family-friendly activities and information planned.



Hampton VA is piloting a "Battle Buddies" program for veterans of past wars to support new combat veterans.

Maryland HCS developed a "Media Kit" for Public Relations and Outreach purposes. The Kit highlights the importance of families in readjustment. It emphasizes the importance of increasing family awareness of the post-deployment adjustment process. Outreach included multiple television, radio and live presentations with dissemination of contact information and public education.

MIRECC Clinical & Research Collaboration: New Study on Health Care

Kristy Straits-Troster, PhD (Acting Co Director, MIRECC Clinical) is leading a new study on health risk behaviors, quality of life and satisfaction with VA healthcare among OIF/OEF veterans. Collaborating on the study are Everett Jones, MD (Co Director, MIRECC Evaluations), Pat Calhoun, PhD (Associate Director, MIRECC Health Services Research) and John Elter PhD (VA Office of Quality and Performance). The



team is conducting a secondary analysis of the Survey of Healthcare Experiences of Patients (SHEP). This national cross-sectional patient survey data was collected by the VA Office of Quality and Performance.

Prevalence of smoking, risky alcohol use, depressed mood, and elevated body mass index was estimated using standardized clinical screening tools. Patient report of provider advice or referral for smoking cessation or substance use treatment was examined. Quality of life and satisfaction with care were determined using standard scoring criteria. The results of this and related projects will be used to guide improvements in OIF/OEF quality of care, customer gender-specific healthcare and service needs/preferences. Preliminary findings have been presented by Clinical and Health Services Research faculty at international scientific meetings and national VA meetings and workgroups and further analysis of this large database is ongoing.
