A Proof-of-Concept, Double-Blind, Randomized, Placebo-Controlled Study of Ganaxolone in Posttraumatic Stress Disorder



Dr. Marx is a co-lead investigator with Dr. Ann Rasmusson from the Boston VA on this newly launched clinical trial of a novel potential treatment strategy for PTSD. Seven VA sites are participating in this effort, as part of a Department of Defense Consortium led by Dr. Murray Stein at UC San Diego. A total of 120 patients will be enrolled over the course of approximately two years. Ganaxolone is a 3ß-methylated synthetic analog of the neurosteroid allopregnanolone, a molecule with pronounced neuroprotective and anxiolytic actions in preclinical models.

Allopregnanolone levels appear to be lower in patients with PTSD and depression, and thus it is possible that replenishing neurosteroids could be a logical new therapeutic approach to mitigate PTSD symptoms.

Supervision for Clinicians Listening to Trauma Histories
